At its July 2021 meeting, the IACBE Board of Commissioners considered the previous Deferral of Accreditation action on your request for the accreditation of the business programs offered by the Alliance School of Business at the Alliance University. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request and granted specialized accreditation to the business program(s) as identified in the "Business Programs" table below, accompanied by the following note(s) and observation(s).

Notes

Notes are an indicator that while the program is in compliance with the Principles, additional monitoring is warranted. The Alliance School of Business is required to take action as specified below and respond to the IACBE by October 18, 2021 (unless another due date is indicated within the Note) using the IACBE Notes Report. Principle 2.1: Outcomes Assessment

While significant progress was made in the outcomes assessment plan that was submitted in response to the deferral, the Board of Commissioners feel that the following items should be addressed along with any other areas that the school identifies as needing revision. To address these items, provide a revised Outcomes Assessment Plan, including updated rubrics, surveys, and other assessment instruments.

1. Ensure that intended student learning outcomes (ISLOs) for the Bachelor of Business Administration and the Business Commerce programs are correctly mapped to the IACBE Key Learning Outcomes (KLOs).

- 2. Replace the current indirect measure of ISLOs for the doctoral program (conference presentations) with an alternative indirect measure (such as a student survey) or an additional direct measure that can be explicitly mapped to the ISLOs.
- 3. Ensure that evaluation criteria in the rubrics for project work for the Business Commerce and MBA programs are clearly and explicitly tied back to the ISLOs being measured.

Observations

Observations are suggestions for further quality enhancements that the Board of Commissioners believes would be helpful for you in achieving excellence in business education but are not required for compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. Action on observations is optional, and reporting is not required.

No observations were made by the Board of Commissioners.

Continued Reporting Requirement

In accordance with the Note given in the Board of Commissioners letter dated January 7, 2021, the requirement to submit an Interim Quality Assurance Report by November 1, 2022, remains in force.

Additionally, upon completion of the review the Board of Commissioners voted to not require an on-site follow-up visit.

Accreditation represents a continuing relationship between an institution and its accrediting organization. Specialized program accreditation by the IACBE is dependent upon your institution remaining (i) in good standing with your institutional accrediting body and (ii) in compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles and Policies.

Your Approved Period of Accreditation is: January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2027

In addition to the compliance reports due annually and listed above, all accredited members of the IACBE are required to submit an Interim Quality Assurance Report (IQAR) during their period of accreditation. The IQAR for the Alliance School of Business will be due by November 1, 2024. Please note that the IQAR due November 1, 2024, is in addition to the IQAR due November 1, 2022.
