Dear Dr. Logan:

The IACBE Board of Commissioners met on July 18-20, 2017, to consider your request for the accreditation of the business programs offered by the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management at the University of Saint Mary. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request and granted accreditation to your business programs accompanied by the note and observations identified below.

## **Notes**

Notes represent areas in which the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management is not in full compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. The department is required to take action on the notes as specified by the IACBE Board of Commissioners, and until the issues identified in the notes have been satisfactorily addressed, the progress made in complying with the commissioners' requirements as stipulated in the notes must be reported each year to the IACBE. Each of the items requested below must be submitted to the IACBE by October 1, 2017. #### **Principle 1.1: Outcomes Assessment**

Please provide the graduate capstone presentation tool and the graduate exit survey to the IACBE by October 1, 2017.

### Observations

Observations are suggestions for further quality enhancements that the Board of Commissioners believes would be helpful to the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management in

achieving excellence in business education, but are not required for compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. Action on observations is optional, and reporting is not required.

# **Principle 3.5: Curriculum Review and Improvement**

The Board of Commissioners recommends that the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management continue to work toward involving the advisory board in curriculum review to ensure that external input is included in the review process.

### **Principle 4.5: Faculty Development**

The Board of Commissioners recommends that the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management work to strengthen the methods used for determining the effectiveness of the faculty development program. While anecdotal evidence is helpful, a more concrete review of the effectiveness of the program may provide support for strategic planning and budgeting efforts.

### **Principle 6.1: Facilities**

The Board of Commissioners encourages the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management to review faculty office spaces to ensure that they provide faculty with space that meets the faculty needs and is inviting to students.

Accreditation represents a continuing relationship between an institution and its accrediting organization. Specialized program accreditation by the IACBE is dependent upon your institution remaining (i) in good standing with your institutional accrediting body and (ii) in compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles and policies. Your accreditation is valid for a maximum of seven years, through July 2024.

All accredited members of the IACBE are required to submit an Interim Quality Assurance Report (IQAR) during their period of accreditation. The IQAR for the Department of Business, Accounting, and Sports Management at the University of Saint Mary will be due by November 1, 2021.
