Dear Dr. Pantic:

The IACBE Board of Commissioners met on July 7-8, 2014 to consider the request for accreditation of the business programs offered by the Department of Business Management and Facility Management and the College of Professional and Continuing Education at Wentworth Institute of Technology. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request and granted accreditation to your business programs accompanied by the notes and commendations identified below.

### **Notes**

Notes represent areas in which the institution is not in full compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. The Department of Business Management and Facility Management and the College of Professional and Continuing Education are required to take action on the notes as specified by the IACBE Board of Commissioners, and until the issues identified in the notes have been satisfactorily addressed, the progress made in complying with the commissioners' requirements as stipulated in the notes must be reported each year in your annual report to the IACBE. Unless otherwise indicated herein, the institution has three years to address the issues identified in the notes.

Principle 1.1: Outcomes Assessment – Degree of Compliance: Substantially Compliant

In their future annual reports to the IACBE, the Department of Business Management and Facility Management and the College of Professional and Continuing Education must report assessment results from the implementation of the revised outcomes assessment plan, which was submitted in response to the site-visit team's report of findings.

Credential information for all faculty members, both full-time and adjunct/part-time, should be available to students either in the catalog or on the website.

In their annual report due by November 1, 2014, the Department of Business Management and Facility Management and the College of Professional and Continuing Education must report on their progress in this area.
