Dear Dr. Fredericks:

At its July 2020 meeting, the IACBE Board of Commissioners considered your request for the accreditation of the business programs offered by the School of Management of Russell Sage College. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request and granted specialized accreditation to the business program(s) as identified below, accompanied by the following note(s) and observation(s).

Notes

Notes are an indicator that while the program is in compliance with the Principles, additional monitoring is warranted. The School of Management is required to take action as specified below and respond to the IACBE by October 30, 2020 using the IACBE Notes Report. Principle 2.1 - Assessment Planning: Excellence in business education requires the development of a comprehensive plan for assessing the extent of student learning in the institution's business programs and the operational effectiveness of the academic business unit. Furthermore, the plan must be driven by the mission of the academic business unit, must be linked to the strategic planning processes of the institution and the academic business unit, and must involve business faculty in all aspects of its development.

A. Redo mapping of ISLOS to both broad-based goals and KLOs. For example, for the BSBA program ISLO #1 is mapped to KLO 1 (Critical thinking) but not broad-based goal 1 (which is also critical thinking).

- B. Ensure that the ISLOs are mapped to a substantial number of KLOs. For instance, once corrected, it appears that the BS/BBA maps to 5/8, the BS Acctg to 4/8, the MS HS to 4-5/8, and the MS OM to 5/8.
- C. Eliminate the use of a performance objective that calculates a score that is averaged over all questions in the assessment instrument. Ensure performance objectives for both direct and indirect measures are explicitly aligned with each ISLO the assessment instrument is supposed to measure. For example, in the BSBA program, the performance objective for the undergraduate internship evaluation can be modified to read:

For **each** of the ISLOs assessed, 70% of employers will indicate that Sage students were "successful" or "very successful" in achieving the outcome.

Similarly, the performance objective for the Peregrine Exit Exam can be modified to specify that: 80% of BSBA students will score at or above average for their cohort **for each subset** of questions related to the ISLOS.

- D. Ensure that the assessment instrument specified really measures the learning outcome. For example, consider whether the Peregrine Exam is the appropriate measure of critical thinking skills (as currently specified in the OAP for BSBA program) or professional communication (as currently specified in the BS Accounting program).
- E. Analyze and report assessments of learning outcomes (such as Peregrine results) separately for BSBA and BS Accounting.
- F. Provide the rubrics used for the paper and presentation associated with the Accounting Simulation which is used as a direct measure for the assessment of the BS Accounting program

Observations

Observations are suggestions for further quality enhancements that the Board of Commissioners believes would be helpful for you in achieving excellence in business education but are not required for compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. Action on observations is optional, and reporting is not required.

No observations were made by the Board of Commissioners.

Additionally, upon completion of the review the Board of Commissioners voted to not require an on-site follow-up visit.

Accreditation represents a continuing relationship between an institution and its accrediting organization.
