Dear Ms. Neupert:

The IACBE Board of Commissioners met on December 8-10, 2015 to consider your request for the reaffirmation of accreditation of the business programs offered by the Department of Management at the Oregon Institute of Technology. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request and granted accreditation to your business programs accompanied by the note, observations, and commendations identified below.

Notes

Notes represent areas in which the institution is not in full compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. The Department of Management is required to take action on the notes as specified by the IACBE Board of Commissioners, and until the issues identified in the notes have been satisfactorily addressed, the progress made in complying with the commissioners' requirements as stipulated in the notes must be reported each year in your annual report to the IACBE. Unless otherwise indicated herein, the institution has three years to address the issues identified in the notes.

Principle 4.1: Faculty Qualifications

Please provide additional justification for S. Ruse to teach in the area of information systems.

The Board of Commissioners granted exceptions to the requirement that faculty members must hold at least master's-level degrees for the following faculty:

- J. Barkee to teach in the area of project management;
- W. Brandsness to teach in the area of information systems;

- B. Goloski to teach in the area of business communication (graphic design);
- V. Jonathan to teach database-related courses;
- Z. Rizk to teach in the area of information systems; and
- K. Schultz to teach in the area of operations management and management.

Observations

Observations are suggestions for improvement by the IACBE Board of Commissioners that it believes would be helpful to the Department of Management in achieving excellence in business education. Action on observations is highly recommended, but is not required.

Principle 3.2: Common Professional Component

The Board of Commissioners recommends that the Department of Management review coverage in the areas of human resource management, operations management, and law in order to ensure that the coverage is appropriate given the mission of the department and the program intended student learning outcomes, and to make any needed changes to ensure quality and academic rigor.

Principle 6.2: Facilities

The Board of Commissioners recommends that the Department of Management review the technological resources that are available to students, specifically the students in the IT programs offered at Klamath Falls, and in the computer lab in the library, to ensure that adequate technological resources are available.

Commendations

Commendations are findings of the Board of Commissioners in those areas in which the board believes that the Department of Management and the institution are demonstrating excellent performance.

- The site-visit team commends the Oregon Institute of Technology for a first-class library and a staff who do an excellent job in assisting with writing, citations, and support for all students.
- The site-visit team commends the Department of Management for the high level of faculty involvement in the local community.
