Dear Mr. Murphy:

At its July 2021 meeting, the IACBE Board of Commissioners considered your request to extend the accreditation period for the business programs offered by the School of Business at St. Thomas Aquinas College. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request.

Accreditation represents a continuing relationship between an institution and its accrediting organization. Specialized program accreditation by the IACBE is dependent upon your institution remaining (i) in good standing with your institutional accrediting body and (ii) in compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles and Policies.

Your Extended Approved Period of Accreditation is: January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2022.

Based on this approval, your site visit will need to occur no later than September 15, 2022. Additionally:

- 120 days prior to site visit – Draft Self-Study due
- 60 days prior to site visit – Final Self-Study due
