- 2. Ensure all assessment measures include items, questions, or components that directly and explicitly evaluate the ISLOS they are designed to measure.
- 3. Ensure all scales/measurements stated in the assessment targets correspond to the scale/rubric evaluation levels. For example, if the rubric uses levels "accepted" or "excellent", the assessment target should be stated using "accepted" or "excellent", not other levels such as "meets or exceeds"
- 4. Confirm that each faculty member meets IACBE requirements to teach the subject areas to which they are assigned.

The aforementioned program(s) is/are now included in the current grant of accreditation and will be added to the school's list of IACBE-accredited programs within 30-days of the Board of Commissioners decision.
