Dear Dr. Power:

At its April 2022 meeting, the IACBE Board of Commissioners considered your request for the accreditation of the business programs offered by the School of Business and Technology at the Wayne State College. I am pleased to report that the Board of Commissioners approved your request and granted specialized accreditation to the business program(s) as identified in the “Business Programs” table below, accompanied by the following note(s) and observation(s).

Notes

Notes are an indicator that while the program is in compliance with the Principles, additional monitoring is warranted. The School of Business and Technology is required to take action as specified below and respond to the IACBE by July 5, 2022 (unless another due date is indicated within the Note) using the IACBE Notes Report. Principle 2.1: Outcomes Assessment

1. Revise the undergraduate Exiting Student Survey (used as an indirect measure) to include an item on page 1 for international business, which is one of the areas identified as part the business core in ISLO 1 but is currently not included in the survey and so not measured twice.
2. Provide the rubric used to measure the oral communication component of ISLO #2.
3. Revise the prompt for item 1 in the MBA Exit Survey to align with the language in the MBA ISLOs. The current prompt refers to students’ “ability to identify” whereas the ISLOs reflect higher categories of learning (use, apply, construct, creates.)

Observations

Observations are suggestions for further quality enhancements that the Board of Commissioners believes would be helpful for you in achieving excellence in business education but are not required for compliance with the IACBE's Accreditation Principles. Action on observations is optional, and reporting is not required.

No observations were made by the Board of Commissioners.

Additionally, upon completion of the review the Board of Commissioners voted to not require an on-site follow-up visit.
