

IACBE Region 1 New England Student Case Competition Rules October 25, 2024

- The competition is open only to student teams from only IACBE Region 1 New England member institutions.
- Due to time constraints, a limited number of teams will be allowed to compete. Team participation is on a first come, first registration basis. Teams interested in competing should register as early as possible by contacting Dr. Jacqueline Jamsheed at jamsheedj@elms.edu.
- Teams must register no later than Friday, October 11, 2024.
- There is no entry fee for the case competition.
- Each team will consist of 3 - 4 members and a Faculty Advisor (Coach).
- Teams that present at the competition on October 25 will have the cost of one copy of the case reimbursed by Region 1 New England.
- Student teams may present in person or via Zoom. This is being done to minimize lost class time and reduce any travel costs to the student teams. Final Zoom instructions and room information will be provided to the student teams and coaches no later than October 23, 2024, via email. It is recommended that student teams presenting over Zoom arrange with their institutions for a private room with a computer, microphone, speakers, and internet connection to minimize potential interruptions while they present.
- PowerPoint presentations must be submitted to your coach no later than Monday morning, October 21, 12 Noon **and** email the PowerPoint presentation to Dr. Jacqueline Jamsheed at jamsheedj@elms.edu.
- Each team will be allowed 15 - 20 minutes to present and up to 10 minutes to answer questions from the Judges. Student presenters will be stopped at the 20 minute deadline without exception.
- Coaches may be available for general guidance when teams prepare their case analysis and presentations but cannot help in the detailed analysis or PowerPoint creation.
- The student teams will present at the following times:
 - The final times will be determined based on the number of teams that will register for the competition. The presentations may be scheduled anytime

between 11:00 AM – 3:00 PM on October 25, 2024. All student teams and coaches will be contacted no later than October 22, 2024, with the final presentation schedule.

- Only the student competitors, Faculty Advisor/Coach, and judges will be allowed to be present at the competition (in person or online). No other people are allowed to be present.
- Judges will review the students work based on the rubric provided and announce a winner at approximately 3:00 PM on October 25, 2024.
