- Models integrity, ethical behavior, and social responsibility
- Provides active, hands-on opportunities for students to “practice accounting”
- Builds strong relationships with students, colleagues, and the accounting community
- Maintains current knowledge in accounting through engagement in accounting related professional development
- Researches and/or engages in innovative ways to teach accounting
- Is active in the accounting profession through accounting practice and/or involvement in a professional accounting organization

Eligibility:

Nominees for the 2025 Ambassador award must be an active volunteer with IACBE and knowledgeable of IACBE Member requirements. In addition, they must have a working knowledge of accreditation in higher education as well as excellent interpersonal and communication skills. Nominees must demonstrate a high level of cultural intelligence. They may be nominated by a peer or self-nominated.

The **Dr. John L. Green Service award** recipient demonstrates service and commitment to the IACBE and to the academic profession in the following ways:

- Contributions to the IACBE include service on:
 - Board of Directors
 - Board of Commissioners
 - Regional Officers
 - Site Visit Team Chair or Member
 - IACBE Committees
 - Other service to the IACBE
- Professional and public service activities include activities in his/her discipline as a practitioner or as a representative of the IACBE.

"Service" is defined as contributions to the IACBE, as well as professional and public services activities.

The recipient of the **2025 Dr. John L. Green Service award** will be recognized at the Accreditation and Awards Banquet on Saturday, April 5th which takes place during the Annual Conference and Assembly Meeting (ACAM). The recipient will receive an individual plaque and must be nominated by a peer.

Nomination Procedure

1. Provide your name and contact information.
